

# VICTORIAN HILL CLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP ROUND 2, FEBRUARY 18, 2023 John Bryant Pics – Kev Wilson

Saturday, February 18 was our first event for the year, and this was VHCC Round 2 – we had over 100 entries for the event, which translated into over 90 by the start of play. This was a twilight event, scheduled to run from 12 noon until around 6 p.m., which it, in fact did, with all competitors offered the opportunity of completing four runs on the day.

The majority of competitors were from our Club, which is very good, but we still managed to have two classes with only one competitor – this, as always, annoys me as I believe that we have too many classes, but it appears as though I am the only person who thinks that way – I like competition! To score points in the Victorian Hill Climb Championship, competitors are required to have a Log Book for their car – those who do not have Log Books can enter in the Non Log Booked Class, but they do not score points – there were 10 entries in this class on this occasion.

Occasional driver Greg Auckland (he normally only competes once a year in the Australian Hill Climb Championship) made the trek over the hills from Leongatha to compete in this event, and certainly showed all other competitors the way to go. Greg recorded at time of 45.46 in his Ninja GA8 to take out fastest time of day by over 2 seconds from South Australian and current Victorian champion Dave Mahon in his Dallara, with a best time of 47.75 seconds. The rest of the Top 10 were all GCC members, with Peter Minahan in the Hayward 3<sup>rd</sup>, Wim Janssen in the Wimp 003 4<sup>th</sup>, Bruce Minahan in the Hayward 5<sup>th</sup>, Mike Barker in yet another Hayward 6<sup>th</sup>, Patrick Malanaphy in the lightning fast semi off road Yacar Cross in 7<sup>th</sup>, Keith Wilson in the original Hayward (Ninja BH1) in 8<sup>th</sup>, Colin Newitt in the Locost Clubman Sports car in 9<sup>th</sup>, and Thomas Inkster in the Historic IDS Sports in position 10.



Bill Roberts was successful in the Formula Vee class, one second in front of Ryan Nothard. Eight competitors in the Formula Libre up to 1300 class, with Dave Mahon successful in front of Peter Minahan, Bruce Minahan, Patrick Malanaphy and Keith Wilson. Greg Auckland took out the FL 1301

to 2000 class, from Wim Janssen, Mike Barker and Noel Lindsay. A good showing of Clubman Sports Cars, with Colin Newitt taking the class from Steve Buffinton, Dale Hocking, Rob Nethercote and Peter Giulieri – Les Dole drove another such vehicle, but it was in the Non Log Book Class until such time as he secures a Log Book. The one thing that all of these Clubman have in common is the excellent presentation of all of the vehicles.



Six drivers and three cars in the Sports Cars Open/Closed up to 2000. Sei Vella was first in front of his father Ray in the Mazda MX5. A Leyland Moke with three drivers sharing were in positions 3, 4 and 5 with David Parr in the Honda Integra in position 6. One more shared car in Sports Open/Closed 2001 and over – Mark Samson was successful in the very nice MG ZS 180, from Louis Lakat in the Supra, and Richard Samson in third. Production Sports Cars 2B&2F up to 2000 saw Ian Speight successful in the Mazda MX6 from Peter Nguyen in the Toyota MR2, Ian Maud in the Fiat X1/9, Gary Birt in the MX5, and Andrew White in an Austin Healey Sprite. In the Prod Sports 2001 to 3000, Eric Irvine was successful in the Porsche Boxster, from Euan Murphy in the Mazda RX7 (by 0.60 of a second), and Tegan Collins third in the Mazda RX8.Lex Thorbeck was the only competitor in the Prod Sports 3001 and over class, and only had to finish to take out prize, which he did.

Sports Sedans featured a good number of entrants in each class. Recently crowned Club Champion Jim McNiven was the front runner in the up to 1300 class, from James Dyer, David Cantwell, Maurice Hanger and Jarrod Bryant. Stuart Haverkort in the Honda Civic was the front runner in the AA 1601 to 2000 class, from Gary McIvor, Mark Baldwin, Steven Carlin and Les Morrall., South Australian visitor Bradley DeLuca was first in the SS 3001 and over class, from Adam Stoddert in his late father Peter's Leyland Clubman (a car not seen at our events for a long time). Another car making a comeback, as was the driver, to hill climbs, was Ernie Corry in third position in the Torana Sunbird. Russell McKenzie was next in the Nissan EXA, followed by Chris Harwood (Holden 438-215), first timer Aaron Daniels in the Corry Torana, and Cheryl Harwood in the Holden 48-215. Jordan James had a lonely time winning the SS 4WD class in the Lancer Evo.

Improved Production classes were well patronised. Rhys Yeomans was first to the judge in the up to 1600 class, from Warren heath, Geoff Bower, Glenn Morris, Terry Selwyn, Dennis Orr, Benjamin Selwyn, Trent Robertson and Laurie Paterson. Kevin Baptist upheld the GCC flag in the IP 1601 to 2000 class, winning by just 0.16 of a second in his Laser from Ayrton Williams in a Renault Clio – he was followed by James Tagliabje, Damian Reilly in an MG, and Damien Beal in a Nissan Pulsar. IP 2001 to 3000 featured only two starters, with Aiden Dare being successful the BMW from Frank Bradley in the Mine (or is it also a BMW?). Geoff Cooling fled the garlic festival in his hometown of Meeniyan to be first to the judge in the IP 3001 and over class, from co-driver Daryl McHugh (rarely seen in a competing car) and Neville McLeod in third. Three cars in the IP 4 WD class, and boy, do these cars leave the start line in a hurry! Lasith Liyanage in the Focus was first, from Pun Hy in the VW Golf, and Thomas Foley in the Audi S3.



Thomas Inkster took the win in the Historic Other class from father Wesley in Thomas's extremely well presented IDS Sports. Steven Weymouth-Wilson was the winner of the Historic Group N up to 2000, from the beautifully presented MG TC of Mark Pitman (is that a Group N car?) and Keven Brown in the Mini, not seen on the track for many years.

Last class for the day – this not really a class, but a combination of classes where the driver/car combination does not have a Log Book. Les Dole was the fastest in his (I think) Watson Clubman, from Frank Penrose in the Datsun 180B, followed by Lloyd Carluka in the Subaru WRX – a mixed bag of cars, as were the other seven in the class.

It appears as though three new records were set on the day (to be confirmed as I wrote this on February 22) – they are Ian Speight in his Mazda MX5 (Production Sports Cars 2B&2F up to 2000), South Australian Brad De Luca I his Ford Anglia (Sports Sedans 2001 and over), and Geoff Cooling, Ford Falcon (Improved Production 2001 and over) – these records will be confirmed by the official keeper of records! Thank you to the people who officiated on the day (nowhere near enough). Ernie Corry, Garry McIvor and Jarrod Bryant ran the start line for most of the day in between driving

duties, with Brett Wild taking over this post for the final run of the day. It is a pity that a number of other driver/members who were asked to do some officiating said NO – remember NO officials = NO hill climb. Congratulations to the annual GCC trophy recipients, who were presented with their trophies prior to competition for the day.

The next competition event for our Club is the East Sale Super Sprint to be held on March 19, with the next hill climb to be held on April 23 – Round 4 of the 2023 VHCC to be run by PIARC at our track.







### **GIPPSLAND CAR CLUB CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP 2023**

Hill Climb Championship For hill climb events, a competitor's best time for the day will be divided by the appropriate class record at the beginning of competition for the day, with the resultant figure being the points scored by the competitor for the day, e.g. Bill Black recorded a best time of 38.11 for the day in Formula Vee, and the class record at the beginning of the day was 36.99 – Black's score for the day is thus 38.11 divided by 36.99 = 1.03. A competitor scoring 1 point for the day will have equalled the class record; a competitor scoring less than 1 point will have beaten the class record, whilst a competitor scoring more than 1 point will have been slower than the class record. Points for the Hill Climb Championship will be counted for all GCC hill climb events designated as rounds of the Club Championship (of which there are 8). The Hill Climb Champion at the end of the year will be the person who competes in the highest number of hill climbs and scores the lowest number of points.

**Sprint Championship** Classes contested at Sprint events conducted by Clubs other than our own will be different to those conducted by the GCC. For our GCC Sprint Championship, GCC competitors will be placed in our own Club Championship classes for the purposes of points scoring. The fastest member in each class will be awarded 1.00 points, with each other competitor in the class being compared to the fastest in the class, e.g. Yolanda Yellow records a time of 73.00 seconds to win the class, whilst Zoe Zentura records a best time of 74.72 seconds to be second in the class. Zoe will thus score 74.72 seconds divided by 73.00 seconds, which gives Zoe a score of 1.02 points. This calculation will be carried out for each competitor in each class. Points for the Sprint Championship will be counted in all sprint events designated as rounds of the Club Championship. The Sprint Champion at the end of the year will be the person who competes in the highest number of sprints and scores the lowest number of points.

**Khanacross Championship** Khanacross Championship points will be scored in the following categories:

- **a.** Production 2WD up to 2000
- **b.** Production 2WD 2001 and over
- c. Production 4WD
- **d.** Specials (as defined in the Supplementary Regulations for an event)
- e. Juniors

Points will be allocated for the first 15 places in each category of the khanacross as follows: 20, 17, 15, 13, 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1. The Khanacross Championship will be awarded to the competitor who scores the highest number of points from (n - 1) rounds of the Khanacross Championship (where n is the number of rounds conducted)

**CHRIS MURPHY MEMORIAL TROPHY** Points will be allocated to Gippsland Car Club member drivers of open wheeler racing cars at each GCC hill climb conducted during 2023. Points will be scored as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> 20, 2<sup>nd</sup> 17, 3<sup>rd</sup> 15, 4<sup>th</sup> 13, 5<sup>th</sup> 11, 6<sup>th</sup> 10, 7<sup>th</sup> 9, 8<sup>th</sup> 8, 9<sup>th</sup> 7, 10<sup>th</sup> 6, 11<sup>th</sup> 5, 12<sup>th</sup> 4, 13<sup>th</sup> 3, 14<sup>th</sup> 2 and 15<sup>th</sup> 1. The competitor with the highest points score at the end of the year will be awarded the Chris Murphy Memorial Trophy for 2023.

**REG COLDWELL MEMORIAL TROPHY** Points will be allocated to Gippsland Car Club member drivers of sports sedans at each GCC hill climb conducted during 2023. Points will be scored as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> 20, 2<sup>nd</sup> 17, 3<sup>rd</sup> 15, 4<sup>th</sup> 13, 5<sup>th</sup> 11, 6<sup>th</sup> 10, 7<sup>th</sup> 9, 8<sup>th</sup> 8, 9<sup>th</sup> 7, 10<sup>th</sup> 6, 11<sup>th</sup> 5, 12<sup>th</sup> 4, 13<sup>th</sup> 3, 14<sup>th</sup> 2 and 15<sup>th</sup> 1. The competitor with the highest points score at the end of the year will be awarded the Reg Coldwell Memorial Trophy for 2023.

**CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP (NEW METHOD)** The club Championship will be made up of Hill Climb, Sprint and Khanacross rounds. Points scored in n – 1 rounds (where n is the total number of rounds contested for the year) for each of the 3 events will be used to calculate final points for the Outright Championship. Where there are 8 Hill Climbs, 4 Sprints and 8 Khanacross events the scores will be taken from the best 7 Hill Climbs, 3 Sprints and 7 Khanacross events. Points will be allocated to the top 15 outright places in each event as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> 20, 2<sup>nd</sup> 17, 3<sup>rd</sup> 15, 4<sup>th</sup> 13, 5<sup>th</sup> 11, 6<sup>th</sup> 10, 7<sup>th</sup> 9, 8<sup>th</sup> 8, 9<sup>th</sup> 7, 10<sup>th</sup> 6, 11<sup>th</sup> 5, 12<sup>th</sup> 4, 13<sup>th</sup> 3, 14<sup>th</sup> 2 and 15<sup>th</sup> 1. The winner of the club championship will be the person with the most points.

**Club Official of the Year (NEW)** 1 point per day is given to an official for assistance with running a race meeting and half a point if they are there less than a full day. The official with the most points will be awarded GCC Official of the Year.



**2023 CALENDAR** Still more dates are included on the Calendar for your perusal, and I believe there will be more to come in the April Valve Bounce.

**CANTEEN** Thanks to the Hickey Family for providing a Canteen service at our February 18 VHCC event – nice to have a hot dog again! The Canteen will also operate at all of our own events this year, including the two VHCC track hires that run at our track (these being the events held in April and August), but it will not operate at track hires run by other Clubs at our venue. Please note that the Canteen will **NOT** operate at our khanacross events.

**SPRINTS** Many of our members compete in sprint events at the various circuits in Victoria, and some actually go to The Bend in SA for such events. As you are aware, we run a sprint championship, and our championship consists of four events at East Sale. We could use events at Phillip Island, Sandown and Winton, but the reasons we use East Sale these days are the new circuit, and also the cost. The next event at East Sale in March costs \$125 per entrant (this is an increase over the previous events, but is due to increased costs of ambulance and permits etc.) – the sprint at Phillip Island today (Feb 11) is \$295 per entry, and most events at Phillip Island cost around this figure. I am told that Winton has increased their daily hire fees to \$25000 from \$19000 last year – the competitors have to wear the increase as Clubs cannot afford to carry such an increase – as such one Club has estimated that the entry fee with this increase would have to be \$400 – a number of Clubs are thus cancelling their hires at Winton. We do not think that it is viable to include the other circuits in our Club Championship due to the cost.



WORKING BEE AND CLUB PRACTICE DAY Our property looks the proverbial million dollars after the Working Bee and Practice Day on February 11, and also after the slashing of the taller grass by David Tulloch. The task now is to keep the place looking like it currently does, so the next working bee and club practice day will be held on Saturday, March 18. We had a number of corporate hires in late December/January (Volkswagen/Cupra, Toyota, Kia, Mercedes Benz plus Honda)) and all commented favourably on the presentation of the circuit – this is a credit to the members who attend these working bees, and also to our Chief Gardner Billy Jennings and his able assistant lan Mayze (I believe that Geoff Cooling drives up from Meeniyan for a visit on some Wednesdays) – if you are interested in assisting in the mid-week working bees, give Billy a call so that he knows that you are coming.

**WINDOW NETS FOR RACING** Included in this edition of Valve Bounce is a copy of an email from Motorsport Australia in regard to Schedule I re Safety Harnesses and Window Nets. Many of our members participate in circuit racing, so will need to take careful note of this information.

WHERE ARE WE WITH OUR NEW TOILETS AND SCRUTINY BUILDINGS? Not there yet! I am glad that I do not have to build anything because the time taken to secure permits for buildings seems astronomical – Ken Neilson tells me that the Planning Permit is close, and that the building may well be in place by the end of April – let us hope that is the case. The one advantage that we have at the present time is that the funding forwarded to us last year for the project is earning us interest!

**OFFICIALS** We are having diabolical trouble getting officials to work at our hill climbs and khanacross events. The jobs are normally very easy – all that is required in most cases is time. I would hate to have to be in the position of cancelling an event on the day of the event because of lack of officials, but it could well happen. Our next event is a Victorian Khanacross Championship, and we need some members who are not competing to assist on the day at the khanacross. The other weekend, we had three such people to run the show, and had to convince some drivers to assist at times, which they are often not keen to do. In actual fact, at our last hill climb a number of members said no when asked to do some officiating for a short time – not a good response. Please remember that you can only get out of a Club what you are prepared to put into it.

**SOME INTERESTING READING AND VIEWING** Our Club is a member of the Association of Motoring Clubs (AOMC), and they publish a very interesting magazine on a quarterly basis – you can access this magazine by looking at AOMC on your website. A number of other magazines are accessible via the AOMC. They include Automotive Historian, the most recent addition of this magazine (February 2023) containing some excellent articles, but it also contains, if you look closely, some u tubes of both Rob Roy and Templestowe Hill Climbs in the old days (places I used to go to when I was a boy!), a Ron Tauranac interview on u tube, a Castrol film of the French GP at Rouen featuring Jack Brabham in a Lotus, and much more to keep you occupied for some time. Altona motor racing circuit also gets a mention in the Chris Charge Collection.

### KHANACROSS, FEBRUARY 26, 2023

Two years ago we were lucky to get a dozen entries to our khanacross events, but then the Mazda MX5 Club became involved, and a few more members from our Club started to compete, and guess what? – last Sunday we had fifty two entries! As with most of our events these days, the field was divided into two groups, with each group undertaking seven tests. The tests are conducted in such a manner that there are two different tracks being used at the one time, so basically two cars are running at the same time on different tracks – this is the only way that we can deal with so many entries.

Nineteen entries were from our Club, one from Club Skyline, three from Pakenham, one from the Victorian Mini Club, one from The Peugeot Car Club, one from the Austin Healey Sprite Drivers Club, with the remaining 26 from the Mazda MX5 Club – good to see seven Clubs represented. Have we, however, created a monster? Many more people are coming to our khanacross events, leaving less room for our own members – the only way that this can be overcome is in the hands of our members – you must enter the event early, as soon as entries are open, if you wish to secure your place in the 50 person field – if you wait until the last minute to enter, you may well miss out. There is no doubt that a small car is the way to go, but some of the larger cars can really go, and put on a spectacular show for the crowd, of whom there were many at the event. There were nine juniors competing, which is excellent.

For those who know the tracks, we used the Car Parks both clockwise and anti-clockwise, the bottom loop both clockwise and anticlockwise, there and back on the north side and there and back on the south side (six tests so far with two going at a time) and "old" car park test clockwise (52 competitors one after the other) to finish off the day. Our biggest problem on the day was that we were decidedly light on for officials.



Andrew Tate of the MX5 Club was the fastest person on the day in his Mazda MX5, defeating GCC member James Dyer in his Suzuki Ignis Sport by just 1.05 seconds. James was followed by Roderick MacNab and Sam Gumina, both MX5 mounted, with perennial winner Matt Paulet in fifth position. Four more Mazda MX5s and one Subaru WRX made up the next five – note that all in the first ten drove small cars. The fastest Junior on the day was Rocco Spinley, who drove a Mazda MX5 into fourteenth position. Twelve months ago, Rocco had huge problems trying to get the car off the line in each test – bunny hops and stalls were the norm, but how things changed in twelve months, and he can now hold his own with the vast majority of the field.



Matt Paulet normally puts on the best show for the spectators, but I think he may now have been surpassed. Whilst he did not feature at the head of the field, Andrew Evans put on a spectacular display in his pink (or is it a shade of purple?) Nissan Skyline – featuring a turbo charged LS1 engine. One would not think that such a super powerful large car could get around some very tight tracks, but it certainly can, due to Andrew's excellent driving ability. The car is obviously well suited to drifting where there are no witches hats to hit, but it seems to be able to zip in and out of tight courses quite easily. Talking of large cars, the Mark Newton Commodore went very well to finish in thirteenth position.

The results for this event are contained elsewhere in this Valve Bounce – apologies if you need a magnifying glass to be able to read the document. Our next khanacross will be held on Sunday, April 23. This event is Round 2 of the 2023 Victorian Khanacross Championship – the only difference between this event and one of our normal khanacross events is the name – do not be put off by the name if you are thinking of entering as our members are as good as the majority of people who enter Championship events. Remember to enter early.

### Dear Club Delegates,

This email is to advise that an information piece is being published today regarding changes made to the 2023 regulations regarding Window Nets for Circuit Racing, as published in the <u>Manual: Technical Appendix – Schedule I Safety Harnesses and Window Nets</u>.

A Motorsport Australia Website article, Social Media articles and EDM is being actioned today. The EDM will directly distribute the information to those within our systems who are Circuit Race Licensed and who carry a Scrutineering Officials Licence.

It is acknowledged that this may take some additional time for those in the Circuit Race discipline of the sport to adapt to this change in the application of a Window Net. Motorsport Australia will tolerate a time frame for this to be implemented through the process of Minor Ineligibility, and the required notation in Automobile Log Books for the Circuit Race discipline.

Scrutineers, in conjunction with event Stewards, are asked to evaluate compliance at each event in the first quarter of 2023. Where a non-compliance is identified it is permitted to apply a Minor Eligibility (<u>form online – Officials Resources/Scrutiny</u>) notice and a Log Book Notation of the matter for rectification by the competitor over a period of an event or two. The expectation is that that by the 3<sup>rd</sup> event of an automobile for the year the matter is resolved or no later than the middle of the year. Scrutineers and Stewards, especially at State level will need to be able to manage this or otherwise seek further advice from Motorsport Australia via email to <u>technical@motorport.org.au</u>

Motorsport Australia is asking for the State representatives to share this information amongst their relevant State Event contacts and related officials for the first quarter of 2023.


