
I did however manage to race something with an 80km Gravel Bike race in Creswick ticked off during May, fair to say I'm not at peak fitness!






BITS AND PIECES, INCLUDING FROM THE BOARD

WHERE ARE WE WITH OUR NEW TOILETS AND SCRUTINY BUILDINGS? Ken Neilson has spent a huge amount of time, both on the telephone and in personal visits, over the past four months dealing with the appropriate authorities to obtain the relevant permits for our new building. I am pleased to announce that Ken now has all of the permits, and construction of our buildings has commenced in an indoor location at Keilor Park, and it will not be much longer before they are on site. I definitely look forward with interest to the next couple of months when the buildings arrive on site – five semi trailer loads – should be interesting. Ken told those at the Annual General Meeting that the end of July is looking good for completion of the project. CLUB POLICIES Update on last month re my skin cancers – I am now up to six operations in six weeks – the moral to this story is to stay out of the sun as much as you can, and take note of the Sun Smart policy included in the May edition of Valve Bounce. The other moral to the story is do not contract infections whilst you are in hospital! The policy I have included this month is the Fire Plan, as follows:


FIRE PLAN

The aim of this Fire Plan is to protect individuals and property in the case of fire, howsoever caused, within the boundaries of Bryant Park, or from fires in the near vicinity which may threaten Bryant Park.

To enable this plan to be carried out, the Directors of the Gippsland Car Club will:

Appoint fire officer/s

- Have on the property an adequate supply of firefighting appliances, with such appliances
 located in appropriate areas appliances to include fire extinguishers, fire blankets and
 water trailer/s
- Train as many members of the Club as possible in firefighting techniques
- Identify and mark assembly points for competitors/spectators in the event of fire
- Erect signs for emergency evacuation of appropriate buildings/areas
- Ban smoking in the Clubrooms and decking surrounding the Clubrooms erect signs to this effect and notify all Club members and visitors of this ban
- Manage the vegetation in all areas of the property this to involve working bees to maintain grassed areas, and occasional grazing with sheep at appropriate times
- Maintain a list of emergency contacts and display such lists in prominent areas around the property
- Liaise with community firefighting services and Energy Australia firefighting services
- Investigate the enclosure of the area beneath the Clubrooms
- Ban all competition at the Bryant Park track on days of Total Fire Ban
- Ensure that all fuel brought to the track is in secure containers
- Endeavour to control combustible materials brought onto the Bryant Park site
- Ensure that all loose items of timber, etc. are placed in secure positions such as within a container
- Maintain an accurate record of all firefighting services on the property, and ensure that all firefighting equipment is fit for the task for which it is intended
- Maintain maps showing the location of all firefighting equipment on the property
- Place fire extinguishers in appropriate positions during competition events
- Engage properly qualified fire/rescue team/s for hill climb events

TYRES One of the things that we are required to do according to our Motorsport Australia Track Inspection documents is to place tyre bundles in appropriate places around the track to minimise the damage to cars and drivers where a car ventures off the track and into a barrier. This is, luckily, a rare occurrence at our track, but we must have the track up to scratch in the event of any incident taking place. There are many car tyre size bundles around the track, but not as many as we should have. The bundles we have in place were put together at working bees – a relatively dirty and time consuming process – as such, we have been slack in producing more bundles. However, in recent times, we have vowed to continue our "bundling" and, as such, procured a truck full of tyres from Pakenham Tyre and Mechanical, thanks to Andrew, which meant that the tyre bundling teams would have to be reconstituted and start producing tyre bundles at our working bees. They have been saved at the last minute, however, by the owners of Phillip Island, who gave us many bundles of tyres (as mentioned in the last edition of Valve Bounce) – all we have to do with these bundles is put them in the right places. Many thanks to James Dyer and his "jockey": Rob Duncan for collecting the tyres in a Dyers Transport truck as shown in the last Valve Bounce - much work has been saved.

WHERE HAVE ALL THE ENTRIES GONE? Sounds like the first line of a song, although flowers would take the place of entries. I am writing this on June 1, the first day of winter, and we have a hill climb in three days' time. The hill climb in three days' time has a very low entry of around 34, one of the lowest figures we have had for a long time. Our khanacross last weekend had more entries. The Queensland Hill Climb Championship last weekend had only 50 entries, around half of what they usually have. This is a one round affair for the year – the Victorian Hill Climb Championship has seven rounds, and usually has around 80 entries at each round. The East Sale Sprint on June 11 has a very low entry as I write. The State Race Series held at Phillip Island last weekend had very low numbers in many of the events. Is there a reason for the low entries? When Covid struck a few years ago our entries plummeted, but that was because people were restricted in their movement around the state. Whilst Covid is still rife from what I hear, it is not restricting movement. The answer must lie in the current economic climate – the Federal Reserve Bank (an independent body to all governments) has increased interest rates on may occasions' this year, the banks have passed this on in a flash, and obviously people who have a mortgage on their house (probably most of the population) find themselves having to repay substantially more as each month goes by. Whilst historically interest rates are not high (ask any member of the older generation who was paying 17% interest on housing loans), they are high for people who took out their loans at a much lower rate of interest than is currently the case – disposable income is thus reduced, and racing of cars in many cases becomes a luxury that many cannot afford, and thus our entries are reduced.

CANTEEN The Board has been informed by the Hickey Family that they are no longer able to operate the Canteen (which they have done extremely well), and the event on June 4 is the last event they will cater for. It has been a very pleasant change this year to have a Canteen after a number of years without one –Rhys did ask at the AGM if anyone is interested in taking over, but was not rushed with offers. If you do not wish to take over the enterprise yourself, do you know of any food trucks in the neighbourhood that we can pursue

STAGING LIGHT AT THE START Some hill climb tracks have a staging light (orange) at the start, whilst some, including us, do not. Bill Jennings is currently pursuing a system that we can install. The installation of such a light system in conjunction with the current traffic lights will make the starting procedure much easier and safer for officials who currently have to line up the cars – this is a job that would no longer be needed



JUNE 4 MULTICLUB HILLCLIMB – OUT AND BACK WITH ANTICLOCKWISE LOOP

A low number of entries, only 34, of which 3 did not participate, a very slippery track to start with, and the opportunity of at least 7 runs each – a good day was had by all entrants, although the weather was extremely cold even though it was sunny. We anticipated around 6 to 10 runs, depending upon driver behaviour and how long it took to complete the runs – we did have a number of spins, and managed to to get to our 7 runs and still finish early which no-one complained about due to the bitter cold. The Out and Back with Anticlockwise Loop is one of the longest we run, and we expected all competitors to score in the 70 and 80 second bracket, although some were in the 90s and 100s, and the fastest was Wim Janssen with 69.38, a new outright record for this track and a new Formula Libre 1301 to 2000 class record.



Second outright on the day was Ewen Moile in the Ramblebee with a time of 74.80, also a new record – this time for the FL up to 1300 class. Jim McNiven was third outright, and first tin top, with a time of 76.81 seconds – also a new record, this time for Sports Sedans up to 2000. Dale Hocking was the victor in the Clubman Sports Car class, and fourth outright. Rhys Yeomans managed a couple of off track excursions in his run to fifth outright with a time of 78.73. Jai Azzopardi was next in a slightly damaged Honda after a brush with a tyre, Ross Read was in position 7 in his Mazda MX5, Ian Speight followed in eighth in his Mazda MX5, Frank Penrose was in ninth position in the Datsun 180B, and Ray Vella rounded out the top 10 in his Mazda MX5.





There were three open wheelers participating, and unfortunately each had to retire early with mechanical problems – others had problems but managed to continue. One problem with a low entry is that many of the classes have very few competitors, three having only one competitor. On the other hand, some classes had a large number of the entry for the day – Frank Penrose was the victor in the Improved Production 2001 and over class, a class with six competitors, which is 20% of the entrants for the day. Production Sports Cars 2001 and over also had six entrants, and this was taken out by Ross Read in a Mazda MX5. There were four entrants in the Sports Sedans 2001 and over class, and this was won narrowly by Tim Boyd in the Falcon ute from Rob Duncan in the Commodore 0.41 seconds behind, and John Mahy following along another 0.25 seconds in arrears in third position – very close competition.





Results are included in this edition of Valve Bounce. Our next Multiclub Hill Climb will be on Sunday, July 16, and we can guarantee a fine sunny day for this event. Supp Regs will be on our website shortly, and the track we will be using for tis event will be revealed in these Supp Regs.
