

# Editorial Ponderings:

Welcome to the June 2024 edition of Valve Bounce.

It was great to finally give the new timing system a proper test at the May 26<sup>th</sup> Hill Climb. This was the first time we have run the reverse track configuration in almost 10 years and the new timing system made us capable of using this layout.

One thing we added into the timing on the day was a split time on the back straight, competitors probably didn't notice as we couldn't get the printing on the day configured to show the split time, but this worked very well and all splits were recorded perfectly. I'll see if we can figure a way to share this soon.

There were a couple of small bugs to fix with the timing to make everything run smoothly, the introduction of a new computer is also giving us a little grief getting the display board working which hopefully won't be super complex to fix. It's important we get this all up and running perfectly over the next few months as we want to use this for the Australian in October.

Equally important on the timing is other people need to learn how to set it up and use it. Currently there are one or two of us who know this which is obviously a major problem if we are not around at an event. Can I please ask people to see me about at least learning how to turn on the beams and set them up before an event to make things easier for everyone.

We have had a very disappointing few weeks at Bryant Park with a number of break ins which have resulted in significant damage to our facilities.

Over the years at both Gippsland Park and Bryant Park we have had periods and incidents where the track or buildings have been broken into and damages and losses have occurred. The most significant at our current location has been the theft of our original tractor during one break in.

In recent times we have had our fences and gates cut, major damage to the tractor shed, theft of a trailer as well as the scrutineering, timing and now clubrooms broken into. In most cases this has involved someone on a motorbike or quad bike.

If you live in the area it's worth keeping an eye out and doing the occasional drive by just in case. Police have been notified in all cases and we look to have some repeat offenders and unfortunately they are getting more brazen each time.

Following a mostly successful test of the new timing system (thank you Jarrod for leading this roll out!) for Sunday's anticlockwise layout, and as a heads up for competitors, the below are the proposed layouts for the remaining 2024 hillclimbs. Since taking over as the competition secretary, I've always aimed to run as many layouts for the year, which hasn't always been possible, but I hope people appreciate the variety of layouts we have been able to offer.

Figure 8 will be run one more time before AHC24, to provide some early testing for any competitors. I expect a few interstate competitors to attend this event.

Once the new building is up and running, there are plans to turn the current scrutineering area into a workshop. We have plenty of storage at Bryant Park, but indoor working space is extremely limited.

# 2024 Australian Hill Climb Championships - Update

I thought I would provide an update of where we are currently with the coming AHCC in October.

- Sponsors We have secured 1 Silver sponsor and now possibly have a second one we are finalising. The number of class sponsors has also increased but we are still a long way away from what we need in order for this event to be financially viable. The biggest thing we need is a naming rights sponsor. I have spoken to a few parties on this topic but we still haven't secured one. We want to be able to provide a significant amount of prize money for this event, however this will need to be cut back if we can't afford it.
- Government Grant I have applied for a \$20k grant from the Victorian Government to support significant sporting events. I have followed up but there is still no answer on the grant as yet.
- Food Van/s Rhys has a coffee van booked and is in the process of securing a food van.
- Volunteers This is still a major issue and we desperately need someone to coordinate the
  volunteers for the event. This is not a super complex task, however it is one that requires
  someone to spend the planning time to ensure we have people in the right places at all
  times.
- Emergency Services and Permits These things are in hand with Fire & Rescue and Ambulance services booked. The permits are in the process of being done, the only thing is that these are expensive parts of the plan and we need more sponsors!
- Bryant Park preparation plan I have started some work on the parking and trailer parking plans. One thing is for sure, we can't allow what we have seen at the recent Victorian Rounds with trailers everywhere in the pits. There will be dedicated trailer parking areas in the grassed paddock behind our pits and in the area behind the pit sheds. All trailers will need to be parked in these areas and we will also not be allowing tender vehicles parked in the pits. Beyond this there will need to be a lot of other minor jobs completed like line marking and general working bee items before we can hold the event.
- Timing We tested our new timing system at the most recent hillclimb. In general it went pretty well but there were a couple of small bugs we need to fix. This testing will continue over the next few events.
- Toilets and Showers I have booked portable toilets to be placed over in the spectator parking area as well as an additional shower which will be placed near the clubrooms. With these and our existing facilities and the new building running we are covered for what we need and all areas of the facility will have toilets close by.

I still need help from people to make this event a reality. Ideally it needs to be people outside of the current board who already have a number of things to work on. If you can help in any way please reach out to me.

### **WORKING BEES AND MEMBERS PRACTICE DAYS**

SATURDAY, JUNE 22

BREAK INS AT THE TRACK My experience with the Club stretches to 50 years on the Board, almost from the time the old Gippsland Park track in Latrobe Road, Morwell, was asphalted. During my time at the old track, I was contacted by the Police on a handful of occasions about a break in at the track – to my memory, the only things I can remember being stolen were three water pumps, which the Police told me would be somewhere up in the Strzelecki Ranges watering "crops" – they were never found. This track was very desolate late at night, a feature shared by our "new" track at Bryant Park. Given the isolated location of Bryant Park, I have been concerned since the track started about 15 years ago that we would suffer break-ins, particularly given our very salubrious club rooms. We had one serious break in a few years ago when our almost new mowing tractor was removed from the property one dark night – the tractor was never seen again. On one other occasion, some clowns in a stolen Commodore decided it would be a good idea to drive through the front gates to probably use the track, which they did not reach, so they drove back out through the broken gates. A Board member located the car in Morwell a short while later in a broken down state, but no action was taken by the local constabulary.

This brings us to the present day. About three weeks ago, a "person" on a quad bike drove through the fence, looked around, broke a couple of doors in the scrutineering area, and left with a trailer, a Post Office "step through" motor cycle (which we used occasionally on khanacross days) and a couple of fire extinguishers, and then left through the same hole by which he/she had entered. It would have been interesting seeing this lot at around 4 a.m. in the morning making their escape. This was reported, but no interest or action was taken. A couple of days ago (May 30), I was informed by Swoop (the organisation that has the communications tower above the garages) that there was no power. Richard Samson visited the track and found that all of the fuses in the fuse box had been tampered with – this was fixed within a relatively short period of time, as was the chain and lock on the southernmost gate to the track. The timing building was also visited, but nothing appeared to have been taken. A person on a trail bike was seen on cameras within the track. Last night, the guad bike rider (who was probably also the trail bike rider) returned through the southernmost gate and decided to do a proper job on the Clubrooms – appeared to have driven through the very large glass door on the toilet side of the clubrooms, broke the door in the Canteen, and broke one of the storeroom doors just inside the entrance to the Clubrooms. Peter Horter answered the alarm, and may have disturbed the perpetrator, but he/she escaped (3 a.m. in the morning). Bill Jennings came across said quad bike a couple of hours later, gave chase, but the quad bike was too nimble for a Nissan 4WD. This time, the police were very interested, and the Crime Scene Investigators were on the scene not long after.

What is the moral to this story? There are many hundreds of good people who have contributed to our track, which is an outstanding asset in the Latrobe Valley, but you only need one "a@#\$%^&e" to wreck the work of hundreds. Keep your eyes open for a quad bike cruising around in the middle of the night.

Not long after we commenced at the new track, one of our members volunteered to become a live in caretaker if we could provide the accommodation. Maybe it is time to think about this. I think the subject of security will be a topic of conversation at the next Board meeting.

CALENDAR A close look at our Calendar will show that our Multiclub Hill Climb which was scheduled for Sunday, June 30 is now Round 3 of the Victorian Hill Climb Championship, to be run on the same day This event was originally scheduled for My Leura at Camperdown in March, but was postponed due to track licence problems. Our Club was asked by the Victorian Hill Climb Advisory Panel if we would run the event, to which we said yes. As we already had an event on June 30, we decided to use that date for the VHCC round. As has been pointed out on many occasions, a VHCC event is exactly the same as one of our Multiclub events except that some of the classes are different, and there are normally more competitors. As such, we have decided to use the Clockwise Short Track, as this will give all entrants up to eight runs on the day. Did you know that even though this is our shortest track it is actually longer than both Rob Roy and Mt Leura, and it takes longer to complete a run – the fastest time of day at the recent Rob Roy round of the VHCC was put in by Mike Barker at a time of just over 19 seconds!

**AMBULANCE** We have both an ambulance and a rescue crew at all of our hill climbs. The provision of an ambulance is mandatory, the use of a rescue crew is not. A number of the track hires at our track do not use a rescue crew. We rarely use either, particularly the ambulance, on the day of an event. A number of members asked why the event stopped the other day when the ambulance was being used for the incident that we had – the answer is simple – the ambulance must be available when competition is taking place, and if it is already being used it is thus not available, therefore there can be no competition.

**AUSTRALIAN HILL CLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP 2024** Reasonable progress has been made with the raising of sponsorship for this event, but nowhere enough at this point in time. The AHCC is a very expensive event to run, and the Club will make a loss on the event if we are not able to raise the funding necessary. Jarrod Bryant would like to hear from you if you are able to assist with the raising of sponsorship. The AHCC is a four day event, not the usual one of two day shows that we normally run. # BACK TO FRONT HILL CLIMB – FIRST TIME IN NINE YEARS!! Pics by Kev Wilson

For the first time in approximately nine years we ran a hill climb using the Reverse Track configuration – this is purely using the complete track in an anticlockwise direction. The field was not large – 42 starters in all with 40 finishers. The aim of the exercise was to have eight runs each for the day, but due to an unfortunate incident this was reduced to seven. Brody Goossens ran off the track after the finish line and hit the concrete barriers very hard – he spent the best part of an hour in the ambulance being tended to by the paramedics, and was later taken to the nearest hospital (LRH) by his father Mick for a complete check. I am happy to say that Mick reported on Monday morning that Brody had a sore knee but little else. The program was held up whilst Brody was in the ambulance, as we are not allowed to proceed if the ambulance is not available for other possible incidents. There were a number of other minor incidents, but none resulted in injury to either car or driver – the one that gave the driver the biggest fright was when Terry Selwyn went down the Mineshaft sideways, backwards and inside out – gave those who saw it a thrill but probably not Terry.



We had one of our newer competitors taking out fastest time of day — Mathew Healey in the Yacar, who finished 0.09 of a second in front of Ewen Moile in the Bumblebee — interestingly enough, both of the cars actually sounded like bumblebees!! Matthew has only had the car a short time, and has not driven in many hill climbs, so it was an excellent effort from him. Peter Minahan was third in the Hayward, only 0.27 of a second behind Ewen. Bruce Minahan, also in the Hayward, was fourth, 1.11 seconds behind Pete. Jacob White in the very grumbly sounding Nissan Skyline (is that because it has a V8 motor?), was the first tin top home in fifth from Steve Lester in the Toyota GR86 — Jacob and Steve are both in the early stages of comebacks after not having driven for many years. Rhys Yeomans in the Honda took out seventh position, with Frank Penrose in the Datto 180B eighth, Jim McNiven, this time driving the Nissan 360Z in ninth, with Dalrick Clubman mounted Dale Hocking in tenth.

There are advantages and disadvantages of having a relatively small field in a hill climb – the advantage to the drivers is that they have more runs on the day, whereas there are a number of classes with very few entrants, and thus there is less competition. Five of the classes had three or less competitors, with two having only one competitor. Most of the classes were won by our new record holders. Dale Hocking had only the record to beat in the Clubman Sports Cars, whilst Matthew Healy had three others in the Formula Libre up to 1300 class, which he managed to win by 0.09 of a second from Ewen Moile, with the Minahan brothers fighting for third and fourth, with Peter taking the third place. Frank Penrose won the Improved Production 2001 and over class from six others in the class, and set a new record at the same time – Curtis Dexter in a BMW was second in the class with Terry Selwyn in the faithful Datsun 1600 third. The Improved Production up to 2000 had six entries, with Rhys Yeomans setting a new record to win from Eliza Forsyth and Brett Matheson. Steve Lester took the record and the win in the Production Sports Cars 2001 and over, with Jim McNiven second and John Trolove third. Ian Speight took the win and the record in the Sports Cars up to 2000 class, finishing marginally in front of Ian Maud by 0.15 of a second with Simon Wills a further 0.19 seconds behind in third – an extremely close class. Wesley Inkster took the win but not the record in the Sports Cars 2001 and over class,, whilst Mick Goossens was the victor in the Sports Cars up to 2000 class by 0.84 of a second from David Casey, with Brody Goossens in third. Jacob White set a new record in winning the Sports Sedans 2001 and over class from Adam Stoddart in second place. Joel Templar was the winner of the Sports Sedans 4WD class in his Subaru Impreza from the Toyota Yaris drive by four members of the Clark family in the next four places. # Robert Shannon Foundation



The Robert Shannon Foundation was established in 2003 to perpetuate the memory of Robert Shannon, founder of Shannons Insurance, who died unexpectedly in March 2000. Robert was an avid classic car enthusiast, who especially enjoyed his 1930 Invicta S Type. He was a strong supporter of the historic motoring movement and was concerned that it was not attracting enough younger people, particularly in the areas of the preservation and restoration of classic vehicles. The Robert Shannon Foundation has no connection with the Shannons Insurance organisation. All correspondence related to the Robert Shannon Foundation should be sent to the Robert Shannon Foundation through the relevant State Council.

**AIM:** After the success of the Shannons 2001 National Motoring Tour, the Australian Historic Motoring Federation (AHMF) established the Robert Shannon Foundation. The AHMF is the national body representing classic and historic vehicle clubs in all states and territories. The purpose of the Foundation is to encourage people under the age of 30 to become involved in the restoration and preservation of veteran, vintage, post-vintage, historic 50's, historic 60', historic 70's and historic 80's vehicles up to 30 years old.

### The Foundation may:

- help with the purchase of specialist tools or equipment
- assist with the actual cost of restoration work
- contribute toward TAFE or other fees
- contribute toward any project considered worthwhile by the Trustees.

**Funds**: The Robert Shannon Foundation operates a limited funds account to fund these grants. Essentially the funds are invested for the year at the best current rates available through an Australian financial institution. The sum available for grants is then based on sum of the interest earned on that investment

To assist in increasing the value of these grants we would appreciate donations to help build our investment funds. Unfortunately, although having gained recognition as a charitable organisation we are still working on the process for tax deductability of donations.

**ELIGIBILITY:** Any person or group of people under the age of thirty years and engaged in studying automotive restoration and preservation or actively working on historic vehicles is eligible to nominate for a grant.

Applications for 2025 grants must be received by the AOMC by May 1st., 2025



# The TAC L2P Program

You may be aware that in Victoria, learners drivers are required to achieve a minimum number of supervised driving hours, in a variety of traffic and weather conditions, before they are eligible to take their test to obtain their Probationary Drivers Licence, in some cases up to 120 hours. There are many instances where these young people do not have ready access to a vehicle and/or a family member or friend willing to provide the required supervised driving. The TAC have devised a program to assist in meeting that need.

The TAC L2P (Learner to P-Plate) Program aims to provide an opportunity for young people aged 16-23 years who face a significant barrier or disadvantage (economic, social or other) to successfully obtain their Probationary Drivers Licence, with the help of a skilled local volunteer Mentor.

The AOMC is very supportive of this initiative and would like to take this opportunity to alert members to the existence of the L2P Program and appeal to members who have an obvious passion for motor vehicles, driving and, dare I say, many with a bit of spare time and a willingness to give a little of their wisdom and experience to help our young drivers, by becoming an L2P Mentor. Initial Mentor training is provided and cars are provided by the L2P Program to conduct the supervised driving sessions.

Most local government municipalities in Victoria run L2P Programs as well as other youth support organisations. Recently, Tony Hall (AOMC Secretary) and Peter Mathews (AOMC Committee) met with representatives of EFYFoyer, a youth education and support organisation who have L2P Programs running in the Glen Waverley and Broadmeadows areas and are actively seeking mentors for around 40 young people on each of their L2P waiting lists. Representatives from EFYFoyer will be guest-speakers at the next AOMC Delegates Meeting in May, where they will explain how their organisation provides assistance to young people and their specific requirements for AOMC member assistance to support their immediate L2P needs.
