MEMBERSHIP PROFILE OF THE CLUB I wrote a series of articles a few years ago about our previous track and our current track, and a number of other historical events. I have been surprised in recent times to learn that many of our members either do not know we had a track before our current track, or knew little about it. One of the tasks I undertake in the Club is to be responsible for the distribution of Valve Bounce and it is hard not to notice the number of new members who join the Club on a regular basis, and the number of people who depart the Club for whatever reason — as such, the membership of the Club is vastly different to what it was five years ago. The Editor of Valve Bounce and myself have decided to raid the archives and include a number of articles from years gone by — apologies if this appears to be boring for more long standing members, but we believe that the articles will be of interest to newer members. I might add that there are a lot of archives, and I have every copy of Valve Bounce from 1977 onwards, and many of the copies prior to that time.

MEMBER PRACTICE Club members are eligible to practice at the track on Working Bee days (provided they have done some work in the mornings) and also on the Saturday prior to competition days on Sundays. When a competition day is on a Saturday, there is no opportunity for member practice. At this point in time, days when practice can be undertaken are as follows (more working bees will be inserted into the Calendar as the year progresses):

Saturday, February 15

ANNUAL PRESENTATION DAY, ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, including a Working Bee, a free lunch, and a practice in the afternoon if you feel so inclined. All of these activities will take place on Saturday, February 15, 2025. Are you interested in being a Member of the Board for next year? In the January and February editions of Valve Bounce, we will include a list of the Board positions and a description of what each task entails. We will also include a Nomination Form for the Board. If you look on Page 2 of the current Valve Bounce you will see a list of the tasks that we currently undertake on the Board – the list next year may or may not be the same.

VOLUNTEERS FOR TRACK HIRES As you will be aware, much of our income comes from track hires, many of which are during the week. As such, the pool of people who can look after these track hires is very small. The rules of the game are that there must be a Board member present during such hires to look after the place and to make sure the hirers are doing the right thing. The rule is also to ensure that a competitor is not at the track on his or her own — one can only imagine what the outcome might be if such person has an accident and they are the only person at the track. I am well aware of the fact that the majority of the Board members work for a living and are thus unable to be at such track hires, so therefore the only people who are usually able to look after these hires are the older, retired Board members, and there are not many of them. I would like to thank Bill Jennings, Cliff Whitehead, Richard Samson and Ian Maud (as well as myself) for looking after these activities. Weekend track hires are a little easier to organise, but we still need more people to learn the timing system so that the very small number who currently do the timing can be rested.

INJURIES AT THE TRACK BUT NOT ON THE TRACK Some years ago I had the misfortune to trip and fall and crack my head on a steel beam whilst I was poking around at the track - had I have been there on my own I might still be there. Luckily for me, Bill Jennings was also at the track and was able to take me to emergency for repairs. In recent times, on my birthday in fact, I had another fall at the track (the first day of the Australian Hill Climb Championship) – not because I am old I might add. I do not like the stairs into the Timing Building, and I always make sure that I am holding on to both side rails when I ascend or descend. On this occasion, I had been to get my lunch, and had a hot dog and a muffin in hand when I reached the steps. I could only hold on to one side. I almost reached the top when my left knee gave way and I fell from the top to the bottom of the stairs – very exciting, but I landed right next to the ambulance, so I was in good hands. I had a right knee replacement on August 14, and I was meant to get the left knee replaced on November 6 – I am still waiting as I removed a large amount of skin from my left knee in the fall, and this is taking a long time to heal. Every Monday I have to photograph the knee and send the photo to the surgeon – he then replies and says – not this Wednesday but next week – next week has yet to come. What is the moral to this story – make sure that you are not at the track on your own in case of accident so that there is always someone there to assist you – I was very lucky because I was not on my own on either occasion. I am pleased to say, however, that the hot dog and the muffin survived the fall.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

CHAIRMAN

The Chairman is the public face of the Board and, as such, should represent the Club in appropriate forums. In addition, the Chairman is responsible for the conduct of monthly Board meetings, and for such other meetings or Club Nights as the Club may hold. The Chairman is also the person who distributes trophies at the conclusion of Club events.

The Chairman's duties at a Board meeting are to ensure that:

- the meeting is properly convened in accordance with the Constitution of the Club. Proper notice
 of a meeting must be given, and a quorum must be present before the meeting is able to
 proceed;
- the Club rules are strictly observed;
- the agenda is prepared and circulated, setting out the items of business to be considered;
- adequate opportunity is given to members who wish to speak at a meeting;
- control of the meeting is maintained;
- he/she acts impartially and that his/her discretionary powers are used in the best interests of members; and
- the meeting is closed only after the business on hand has been properly concluded.

It is the Chairman's responsibility, therefore, to ensure that the objectives of a meeting are achieved. To do this he must preserve order and regulate the proceedings so as to give all persons a reasonable opportunity of participating in the meeting, and voting on motions.

DEPUTY CHAIRMAN

The Deputy Chairman shall deputise for the Chairman when the Chairman is unable to be present at Club functions. This will include the chairmanship of committee meetings, trophy presentations following events, and such public functions that the Chairman would normally attend in his/her role.

TREASURER

The treasurer is responsible for

- the collection and banking of all monies received by the Club;
- the payment of accounts incurred by the Club;
- the presentation of a monthly financial statement to the Board;
- the preparation of annual financial reports for presentation to the nominated Club Auditor;
- the presentation of the annual financial reports to the Annual General Meeting of the Club; and
- the forwarding of appropriate annual reports to the Office of Corporate Affairs.

SECRETARY

The Secretary is responsible for the general administration of the Club, personnel administration (if necessary) and secretarial work of the Club. The Secretary has the following responsibilities which are directly concerned with Board meetings of the Club:

- planning for Board meetings;
- issuing notice of the meeting;

- preparing the agenda for the meeting this should be circulated to members with the notice of the meeting;
- keeping the minutes of the Board meetings (unless a separate Minutes Secretary is appointed);
- maintaining Club records where appropriate these could include registers of members, and any other records required by statutory authorities;
- to assist and inform the Chairman where necessary;
- carrying out the decisions of the Board meetings when instructed to do so;
- acting as the Public Officer for the Club;
- collection and distribution of all mail received by the Club, including presenting a record of all correspondence received to the monthly Board meetings;
- oversee advertising and sponsorship contracts; safekeeping of Club records.

COMPETITION SECRETARY

The Competition Secretary has the following responsibilities in regard to the organisation of motor sporting events carried out by the Club:

- preparation of appropriate paperwork to be forwarded to Motorsport Australia for the issue of a permit for the proposed event;
- forwarding of Supplementary Regulations to prospective entrants for an event;
- organisation of appropriate ambulances and safety vehicles for events;
- preparation of a competition calendar for the Club, with such calendar to be included in each edition of Valve Bounce;
- collation of results for an event, and forwarding of such results to Motorsport Australia and event competitors;
- advising the Board on all matters concerned with competition;
- report to the Board on a monthly basis.

PROPERTY MANAGER

- responsible for the maintenance of the grounds, not including the track;
- call working bees to carry out the required maintenance;
- liaise with outside contractors where necessary;
- responsible for the safe keeping of club property (e.g safety vehicles, mowers), and advise the Board of new assets required to ensure the ongoing maintenance of the property;
- maintain an inventory of Club equipment;
- responsible for the maintenance of the Club radios;
- report to the Board on a monthly basis.

PUBLICITY AND MARKETING

- responsible for publicity of all events conducted by the Club in as many areas of the media as
 possible this will include local newspapers, radio and television, and, where appropriate, the
 national motoring media. Following the event, results of the event should be forwarded to all
 areas of the media; and
- report to the Board on a monthly basis.

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

- responsible for the maintenance of Club membership records;
- forwarding of membership cards and other relevant information to members as they pay their annual membership subscription, or, for new members, as they join the Club;
- forwarding the names of people applying to join the Club to the Secretary for inclusion on the Agenda for the next Board meeting;

- making recommendations to the Board as to the level of annual membership subscriptions; and
- forwarding appropriate membership information to CAMS if required.

VALVE BOUNCE EDITOR

- responsible for the production, collation and distribution of the monthly magazine;
- responsible for the maintenance of the Club photocopier;
- responsible for the purchase of all materials required for the printing of the magazine;
- encourage contributions to the magazine by Club members;
- report to the Board on a monthly basis.

HEALTH AND SAFETY OFFICER

- advise the Board on relevant Health and Safety issues;
- attend appropriate OH&S workshops
- check for OH&S issues at all events, and advise competitors who are in breach of OH&S guidelines, e.g. faulty equipment, unsafe practices, etc..
- check GCC assets on a regular basis and advise of any problems:
- report to the Board on a monthly basis

KHANACROSS

- preparation of appropriate paperwork to be forwarded to Motorsport Australia for the issue of a permit for the proposed event;
- forwarding of Supplementary Regulations to prospective entrants for an event;
- organisation of appropriate ambulances for events (if necessary);
- organisation of trophies for events (if necessary);
- preparation of a khanacross competition calendar for the Club, with such calendar to be included in the each edition of Valve Bounce;
- collation of results for an event, and forwarding of such results to Motorsport Australia and event competitors and to the Valve Bounce editor;
- organise the conduct of khanacross events; and
- report to the Board on a monthly basis

BRYANT PARK BUILDINGS

- responsible for the buildings situated within Bryant Park;
- responsible for the assets contained within the buildings;
- advise the Board of works etc. that need to be carried out to retain the buildings in peak condition;
- liaise with outside contractors required for building works;
- call working bees where necessary to carry out work on the buildings;
- report to the Committee on a monthly basis on matters relating to buildings.

BRYANT PARK TRACK

- responsible for the racing circuit;
- advise the Board of works etc. that need to be carried out to retain the track in peak condition;
- liaise with outside contractors required for track works;
- call working bees where necessary to carry out track works;
- report to the Board on a monthly basis.

CLUB POINTS SCORER

- maintenance of points scores for the various championships conducted by the Club, and inclusion of up to date points scores in Valve Bounce on a monthly basis;
- maintenance of track records
- regular update of Club perpetual trophies;
- report to the Board on a monthly basis

TRACK HIRE

- responsibility for booking of track hires, and for forwarding appropriate paperwork to hiring clubs;
- responsibility for booking clubroom hires;
- report to the Board on a monthly basis

CLUB WEBSITE/FACEBOOK PAGE

- responsible for the administration of the GCC website;
- responsible for the oversight of the GCC Facebook page;
- encourage GCC members to contribute information for the GCC website; and
- report to the Board on a monthly basis

SOCIAL DIRECTOR

- organisation of social activities including club barbeques, including working bee barbeques, annual general meeting, annual presentation day/evening;
- organisation of social activities such as visits to places of interest, the organisation of social motoring events such as Treasure Hunts, Observed Section trials, etc.;
- prepare articles for Valve Bounce to promote social events; and
- report to the Board on a monthly basis

CLUB PERMIT REGISTRAR

- responsible for all matters pertaining to Club Permit Registration;
- maintain a record of all Club Permit holders in the Club:
- liaison when necessary with Club Permit holders;
- report to the Board on a monthly basis

All of the above personnel are at liberty to recruit other club members to assist with the carrying out of their role, eg. there may be a property sub-committee, a khanacross sub-committee, an assistant secretary, an assistant Valve Bounce editor, an assistant treasurer – in this way, more people will be involved in the management of the Club without increasing the size of the Committee to unmanageable proportions.

Members can nominate and be elected to carry out more than one position on the Board.


AN UNFULFILLED DREAM - DID IT EVER HAVE A CHANCE OF SUCCESS? -John Bryant

"This report investigates the possibility of establishing a motor cycle race circuit in the Latrobe Valley using an existing public road network. The proposal to establish a motor race circuit in the Latrobe Valley using existing public roads was first presented in August 1991. A major presentation, conducted by the Latrobe Regional Commission was made to relevant groups and organisations. The decision to conduct a two-stage feasibility study was supported by Traralgon, Morwell, Moe and Narracan Councils. Funding for the study was made available by the LRC and Sport and Recreation Victoria." (Latrobe Valley Road Race Circuit Feasibility Study, 1994 pages 1 and 2).

A number of you will have been members of the Club at the time of this report, whilst it will be new to others, particularly those who were not even born in 1994! At the time of this study, our Club was going along nicely at Gippsland Park, and most knew little of this proposal. This did change in the next couple of years, however. The driver of the project was a local, Col Murray, who did work for the LRC. Col produced a further study entitled "Latrobe Region Motorsports Complex Feasibility Study" in August 1997. The scope of this study broadened considerably from the initial motor cycle proposal – it now included motor racing, motor cycle racing, speedway, hill climb, off road cars, go karts and drag racing. The published study included letters of support from numerous government and non-government organisations, and all indicated a high level of support for the project. You have to remember that this was a time when the SEC had been privatised, and there was widespread unemployment on the Latrobe Valley, and any project which may help to alleviate this situation was favourably looked upon. To go back a year or two: a meeting was called in Traralgon in October 1995, hosted by the newly formed Latrobe Council to establish the Latrobe Region Motorsport Complex Committee as a special committee of the Council, with specific powers, duties and functions relating to the conduct of a detailed feasibility study. Peter Beasley was elected Chairman of this group, and I was elected Secretary, positions we held until the Committee petered out. It is interesting to note, however, that the Committee has been re-formed in the last couple of years, apparently without motor sport representation, to look at the possibility of developing a motor race circuit in the Latrobe Valley - not much is heard about what is going on from this committee which is largely Council-based. It is further interesting that a motor race circuit proposal for Pakenham is much further advanced in planning - will either or both or none of these circuits actually come to fruition?

I have the minutes of all of the meetings of the LRMCC, and if I could be bothered I would go through them all so that everything I say is factually correct, but the plain simple fact of the matter is that I cannot be bothered! Meetings of the Committee took place on a monthly basis, with many suggestions as to how each of the various components of the motor sport world in the Latrobe Valley night fit into the overall plan. Given the topography of the Haunted Hills area, it was reasonably obvious that a drag racing strip would be very difficult to incorporate into the overall plan, so the drag racers took a relatively early exit from the Committee. Others followed, until it was basically left with motor vehicle road racing and speedway, i.e Gippsland Car Club and Moe Speedway. The Committee, via the Council, had enough influence to have a professional Economic Impact and Job Creation Study carried out (with a large amount of State Government funding) by a five person team from IER Strategic Planning, and this was published in October 2001. The study makes fascinating reading, but I will not bore you with all of the details, apart from a few salient features:

Latrobe Valley Road Race Circuit



- The project would require \$15 million of investment capital (imagine how much that would be today)
- The project had the capacity to create the equivalent of 92 jobs in the first year, rising to 105 in five years (remember that this study was done at a time of high unemployment in the Latrobe Valley, and any success of the project would hinge on whether or not it would create jobs or bring tourists to the area)
- Revenue generation for the area was estimated at \$8.5 million in the first year
- The Haunted Hills 500 (the event that was envisaged for the track) would create more that \$20 million worth of publicity from television alone

- In five years, it was estimated that the event would bring in over \$46 million of economic benefit to the Latrobe Valley
- At the time of this study, an engineering study had also been carried out, and this concluded that "there appears to be no technical reasons why the proposal cannot be achieved, however there remain some political and statutory requirements to be addressed prior to detailed design commencing"

The big question is — WHY DID IT NOT HAPPEN?? I am not privy to the entire behind-the-scenes discussions that took place at other than our committee level, but my one and only guess is POLITICS!! Every study undertaken, and every organisation approached, said that the development of the track would have been to the advantage of the local community, but it never happened. The ironic part of the whole deal is that the Council has now resurrected the Committee (as mentioned previously) and is planning for a motor race circuit in the Latrobe Valley (not the Haunted Hills) — as I asked before, will it happen? Who knows?

What I do know, however, is that we actually had at least two, and possibly even three, events at the Haunted Hills long before our hill climb track moved to the area. Peter Beasley and myself decided very early in the day that a good way to get the public onside, would be to run some sort of event of the 5.6 kilometre circuit. We knew that we could not run a race meeting because the infrastructure costs would have been enormous, so we decided upon a regularity event for the circuit, and maybe a hill climb or two for the Haunted Hills Road section.

Consultation with CAMS was the next step in the process, with a track inspection to take place to determine the suitability of the track for a regularity event. To the surprise of both Peter and myself, the requirements for a track for a regularity event were almost the same as for a race meeting – scratch that idea. To our further surprise, we were told that we could run a sprint meeting at the circuit – we both thought that cars in a sprint event would be going faster than in a regularity, but who were we to ask questions? A sprint it was. Sunday, March 29, 1997 was the chosen day.

I have absolutely no idea how long before that date that planning started, but it was an extremely long time, as it is far from easy to organise an event on public roads – we are lucky that we have always had our own tracks and have not had to worry about this aspect of organisation. I have done it since this time (in 2003) with a hill climb when the Gippsland Car Club started Mt Leura hill climb off after a closure of some years, and that was far from easy and it was only one road (most of you would not have known about that but I do have the track licence for Mt Leura for 2003 in my possession!!).

How do you go about planning for an event on a road circuit which had never been used before (and unfortunately has not been used since)? There was a large traffic island on the corner of Haunted Hills Road and De Campo Drive – the Council (or was it VicRoads) had this removed as it was very dangerous the way it was. At around this time, the Council erected many signs on the roads leading on to the track stating that the road would be closed between certain hours on March 29, 1997. The Council (or was it another organisation) arranged for a very large number of water barriers to be delivered to the track which we were able to use in the appropriate places. The Council provided barriers to block off all of the roads leading on to the circuit. CAMS deemed that a chicane be placed at the top of the Coach Road Hill, where we placed the start finish line, so that cars would be slowed down at this point. We used the area at the top of the hill as the pit area. We even had a double

decker bus to use as the timing bus – I have no idea where that came from, but it does have Warragul written on it somewhere so I guess it came from Warragul.

For the event itself, we needed Police in attendance, ambulance, tow vehicles, and a huge amount of manpower. People were required to put all of the barriers in place (and remove them) at the appropriate times, to be officials in a line of sight situation (and that is a lot of officials around a 5.6 kilometre circuit!), and some heavies to man the road blocks to stop the general public from entering onto the racing circuit whilst it was being used. De Campo Drive is the main road to the Yallourn W Power Station from the eastern end of the LV, so many people were somewhat disgruntled when turned back and made to go the long way (quite a long way). The same applied to some who lived in other areas around the track – in fact, one resident from an area close by decided to crash the road block with his car and trailer to get to the Moe Tip – probably came from Fairway Drive Peter Horter! Another decided to try the same trick from a different road block, and was somewhat frightened when he was overtaken by a racing car going considerably faster than him, so he took to the scrub alongside the track.

When the big day arrived, all was in readiness – all we lacked was competitors – nine in all, two of whom did not start. The results of the cars follow (we did also have motorcycles, but I do not have any results from them):

The entry was disappointing when one compared it to the amount of work that had to be undertaken to put on the event, but it did show that the circuit was fantastic, that an event could run there, and we were optimistic for the future – misplaced optimism as it turned out.

We ran at least one and maybe two hill climbs, starting at the intersection of De Campo Drive and Haunted Hills Road, and headed in a clockwise direction to Bill Schulz Drive, where the track turned to the right, with the finish line somewhere in the vicinity of the where our Clubrooms now are. I have a notion that one of the hill climbs was a car event, and the other was for motorcycles, but I do not have any results for either. I believe that Rod Schilling drove his Mazda RX7 in one of the events, and it is entirely possible that current member Rick Dathan rode his motor cycle in one. If you happened to compete in either you may be able to fill in the dots.

The LRMCC continued to meet for a number of years: we knocked on thousands of doors, had heaps of publicity, but then the LRMCC slowly faded away as did the dream for the Haunted Hills Motor Racing circuit. We did have renewed hope in around 2005 when it became evident that we would have to move our hill climb, but that amounted to nothing.


